<u>Cathechesis:</u> Here in the West, Epiphany has come to mean the visit of the Magi, who represent all nations Here it refers to God being made known in the person of Jesus to the Magi. You can find the record of the event in the Gospel of Matthew. The Fathers of the Church interpret the gifts the Magi brought to be symbolic: Gold-royalty, Frankincense-divinity, and Myrrh-passion, of Christ. Please pray the Novena to the Magi in anticipation of Epiphany to honor the wise men from the Gentiles who faithfully sought out the Christ Child near the time of His birth. Tradition holds that they returned home, converted to the Catholic Faith, and were later baptized by St Thomas the Apostle.

<u>From the Father's desk:</u> Today the Church celebrates the great Feast of Epiphany. God's light is revealed to the nations. The light is of course the Christ Child and the coming of the Magi from the East represents all non-Jewish coming to worship the newborn King. These wise men following a bright star until it led them to the small hamlet of Bethlehem in Judah. There they offer the child gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. Each of these gifts reveals to us who the Christ Child really is: Gold for a king, Frankincense for a prophet and Myrrh for a priest or sacrifice. Jesus is king and prophet and priest for all nations.

It is perhaps a good time for us to reflect on who Jesus is for us. If He truly is our king then we should give him honor and glory everyday, not just on Sunday or when it is convenient in our busy schedules. If He is a prophet, then we should listen to His words that guide and direct our lives toward the kingdom of heaven. If He is our priest, then we should be uniting our sacrifice with His before the throne of God.

If we believe that Christ Jesus is who Magi believe him to be, King, Prophet and Priest then there should be nothing that would stand in the way of following Him. The Magi follow a star and found the promised one of God, a savior. We are called to follow the savior and find a home in the heavenly kingdom. The Wise men, like the Shepherds before them went home rejoicing for all they had seen. We too should be rejoicing for the promise of salvation has been extended to us to be grafted on to the branch of Jesse and made heirs to the kingdom of God.

Questions: How is the celebration of Epiphany relevant to me today? Do I think of Jesus as a king, prophet and priest? Is the gift of salvation something I take for granted?
