From the Catechism: We believe that God is good and all that God created is good, so what happened? Why is there an abundance of problems in our World? Where does the **evil** (moral, physical, natural) come from? To understand the reality of **sin** we need to look at the relationship that God first crafted with mankind. The story of Adam and Eve in the book of Genesis reveals this wondrous relationship. They were given the gift of **Free Will** so that they could chose to love and follow his command; however, they were tempted by the **Satan**, who was an angel of heaven who already refused to love and serve God. Adam and Eve when tempted likewise chose to disobey God. So **disobedience** was the first sin through which all sin entered the world.

Now what was the fallout of that first sin? Well, all humanity lost that original grace of God's friendship, then there was inner disharmony with each person, next came disharmony between people (greed, war, strife) finally death entered the picture. The first sin (**original sin**) is something that each of us must deal with in our relationship with God. We are weakened and are inclined to sin, the church calls this state **concupiscence**.

The Church's doctrine of **Original Sin** is closely connected to the redemption brought by Christ. Our wounded human nature is always subject to the devil's power. But with Christ's death and resurrection we can have a share in his victory over sin and death. Through the sacraments we are filled with grace to help us fight against the temptation of sin. The church professes that God permits evil so that some greater good might be revealed. **CCC # 385-417**

Questions: What wound of sin do I feel in my own life? Do I try and review each day to see where I was tempted? Can I accept the grace God offers me to love and serve Him better?
