It's an exciting time to be Catholic! The National Eucharistic Revival is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to the Eucharist; the greatest gift God has ever given to humanity and the very source of our strength. It's a call to encounter the reality of the Real Presence and fall in love with your faith like never before!

The Eucharist is the greatest gift that Jesus has given us because it contains His very self. At the Last Supper Jesus says to His Twelve Apostles, “No one has greater love than this, to lay down one’s life for one’s friends” (Jn 15:13) Then He makes that statement real in the gift of the Eucharist when He says, “This is My Body given up for you...this is my Blood poured out for you” (Lk 22:19-20). He gives this saving self-gift, his Paschal Mystery, an enduring presence in the Eucharist so that for all ages we would be able to receive this gift and learn to make a gift of our own lives, laying down our life for Him, as He did for us.

The National Eucharistic Revival is a three-year effort of the Church in the United States to help us be healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist – and then sent out on mission “for the life of the world” (Jn 6:51). On June 11, 2023, we began the Eucharistic Revival’s parish year – the middle of a 3-year effort to boldly proclaim the Gospel in our communities. Let us make the Holy Father’s prayer for our parish be our own. Let us be daring. Let us rethink the style of our parochial communities. We pray that parishes, placing communion at the center, may increasingly become communities of faith, fraternity and welcome towards those most in need.

You are invited to deepen your relationship with Jesus Christ, Our Lord, through the celebration of the Eucharist, our monthly Jesus and the Eucharist program and our adoration Encounter Nights.

May your week be blessed with a greater encounter of His Presence.
