2022 Annual Diocesan Appeal: As of April 1, 2022 St. Patrick's has received pledges or gifts from 14 donors for a total of \$6,155 toward its 2022 ADA goal of \$15,939 leaving a shortfall of \$9,384 and St. Joseph has received 51 pledges or gifts for a total of \$20,735 toward its goal of \$37,178 leaving a shortfall of \$16,443. Please remember that any shortfall at year-end will have to be paid to the Diocese by the parish and is paid out of the general tithing collections. For the 2021 ADA campaign, St. Joseph paid \$429 for its shortfall and St. Patrick's received a refund of \$1,525.

<u>From the desk of Fr. Dooley:</u> This is **Passion Sunday** or Palm Sunday; it is the beginning of Holy Week. The procession recounts Jesus entry into Jerusalem with shouts of Hosanna. It is during Mass that we hear the Passion Narrative according to St. Luke. The evangelist tells us how Jesus teaches, heals and forgives even as He is being crucified. Holy Week marks the Church's annual celebration of the events of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection, which we call His Paschal Mystery

Throughout Lent we have been following Christ to Jerusalem, towards the Cross. This final week of the journey becomes a time of intense prayer and leads us to solemnly celebrate the **Sacred Triduum**; the holy three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

On **Holy Thursday** at 7p.m. we celebrate the **Mass of the Lord's Supper** in which we remember the gift of Christ's Body and Blood given for us and we clearly see the connection it has to service through the washing of feet, the Mandatium. That evening following the Mass we are invited to spend time in quiet adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, just as the disciples were asked to keep our Lord company in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Good Friday and the Veneration of the Cross will be at 7p.m., we again read the Passion Narrative, this time from the Gospel of St. John. Then we venerate the Cross on which hung our salvation. There are no celebrations of the sacraments on this day, Communion is received having been consecrated at the Mass of the Lord's Supper. It is a solemn and somber time when we remember that the Christ died to save us from sin.

Finally, we come the **Holy Saturday** and the Celebration of the **Easter Vigil** at 8p.m. In darkness the light of the risen Christ shines out. We hear the ancient biblical stories of God saving His people. Then we hear about the empty tomb. It is a great moment in the life of the Church. Christ has conquered and the Glory of God shines brightly. All this leads to the joys of Easter Sunday Morning and scriptural account of the Resurrected Christ.

I would like to personally invite you and your family to come to the events of Holy Week. The Sacred Triduum this year will be at St. Joseph's in Winterset. If you cannot attend, please consider reading the scriptures for those days and enter into the sacrificial spirit of the week.
