2022 Annual Diocesan Appeal: As of April 1, 2022 St. Patrick's has received pledges or gifts from 14 donors for a total of \$6,155 toward its 2022 ADA goal of \$15,939 leaving a shortfall of \$9,384 and St. Joseph has received 51 pledges or gifts for a total of \$20,735 toward its goal of \$37,178 leaving a shortfall of \$16,443. **Please remember that any shortfall at year-end will have to be paid to the Diocese by the parish and is paid out of the general tithing collections. For the 2021 ADA campaign, St. Joseph paid \$429 for its shortfall and St. Patrick's received a refund of \$1,525.**

From the desk of Fr. Dooley: Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia, the Lord has risen from the tomb!!! Dear brothers and sisters we are now celebrating Eastertide. For the next fifty days the joy of the Lord's resurrection is placed upon our hearts. Easter is a time of uninterrupted joy and feast, during which we celebrate Christ Jesus's Resurrection, Ascension and the Coming of the Holy Spirit upon His apostles and on His Church.

In the liturgy of Eastertide, we commemorate the various appearances of our Lord, during which He instructed His Apostles and prepared them for the coming of the Holy Spirit following His return to the Heavenly Kingdom at the Father's right hand. He returns there to prepare a place for us.

The triumph and joy of Eastertide is reflected in the decoration of the sanctuary and the vestments that the priest and deacon wear. Every year at Easter the Church rejoices for a double reason: Christ has risen, and we are redeemed.

The Paschal Candle shines in the sanctuary next to the ambo as a symbol of the visible presence of our Lord upon the earth. The joyful repetition of "Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia" which was omitted since Ash Wednesday returns as a proclamation of joy and peace.

Our savior Jesus Christ confounded all his enemies by clothing in glory and splendor that body which has been a Victim of the cruelty through the passion. Christ's triumph over death is the most conclusive proof of His Divinity and is the foundation of our faith. "The Lord has risen, indeed He has risen."
