2022 Annual Diocesan Appeal: As of March 18, 2022 St. Patrick's has received pledges or gifts from 2 donors for a total of \$1,555 toward its 2022 ADA goal of \$15,939 leaving a shortfall of \$14,384 and St. Joseph has received 26 pledges or gifts for a total of \$12,600 toward its goal of \$37,178 leaving a shortfall of \$24,578. **Please remember that any shortfall at year-end will have to be paid to the Diocese by the parish and is paid out of the general tithing collections. For the 2021 ADA campaign, St. Joseph paid \$150 for its shortfall and St. Patrick's received a refund of \$1,600.**

From the desk of Fr. Dooley: This coming Friday April 8th the Diocese of Des Moines will hold the annual Chrism Mass at 5pm at The Cathedral of St. Ambrose. It is part of the preparations for the Sacred Triduum (Holy Three Days) of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Each Year all around the world and in every diocese the priests gather with their Bishop and the faithful to celebrate the Chrism Mass. (The word Chrism has its roots in the word Christ, which mean the anointed one.) During the Mass the priests renew their priestly commitment. Then together with the Bishop the three oils are blessed or consecrated. The oils signify the church mission to teach the faith, bring healing and consecrate people and objects for divine worship.

The first oil is the Oil of Catechumen which is used at baptism. Its roots are from the 4th century and is a symbol of strengthening the person who is preparing to receive baptism. It is the hope of the Church that the teaching (catechesis) of Christ will fill their hearts.

The second oil is the Oil of the Sick and is used in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. It confers God's grace on the sick person. We are asking for healing of mind, body and spirit for the person anointed. The sacrament also assures the person that the community of the church is praying for them in their need.

The third oil is the Oil of Chrism. It has balsam, a sweet fragrance added to it. This oil is used at Baptism and the Sacrament of Confirmation and at Ordinations and also for dedications of Churches and Altars. Those objects are for the service of the Church. Like the Oil of the Sick, Chrism confers a God's Sanctifying Grace.

So, you see that the Holy Oils are outward sign to help us to perceive the presence of Christ in the action of the Church. The Holy Oils are at St. Patrick's and St. Joseph's are displayed in the Ambry hung near the baptismal font.
