From the desk of Father Dooley: My dear friends, what a week it has been. Last Saturday's tornado brought devastation and grief, lives were lost, and lives were spared. The outpouring of items through the Red Cross came from all over the county. Volunteers by the bus loads came to help sort through the debris. Groups made quick work of cleaning up the damage. Now the difficulty will be to bury our neighbors and friends who died in the destruction. God rest their souls.

Many have asked when will St. Joseph and St. Patrick collect money or have a fundraiser? My immediate response is: Let's get to it! However, after visiting at the Red Cross shelter at New Bridge Church and seeing all the items that have been donated, I think we could wait. Right now, lots of people from all over the state and nation are wanting to help the families displaced by the tornado. Eventually the attention will be drawn to the next disaster but there will still be a need here in Madison County. That is when we, the local faith community, will be needed to provide for our neighbors.

In the days and weeks ahead, there is still going to be a need in our county and that is the moment that members of St. Patrick's and St. Joseph's will be able to organize assistance. For the moment I would encourage you to give of your prayer, your time and your money to events and programs that are already up and running. Donate to the Great Madison County Community Foundation's Disaster Relief Fund. Many of our parish organizations can make a substantial contribution. Volunteer at Red Cross Shelter. Offer your daily rosary for the families, for the volunteers. This is like a marathon, we need to pace ourselves and be ready to help in the months ahead.
